With the sailing, boating and water sports season in full swing, I wanted to take a moment to tell you about a local company, a wife and husband team, Romine Seating, Inc. who just replaced our old vinyl bar bolster in the clubhouse. Amber and Levi Romine, the owners and craft professionals, did a terrific job removing the old worn-out bolster and padding and replaced it with a far nicer and more durable one. None of the other upholsterer's we contacted wanted to do the work, or quoted unreasonably high estimates to do it. Finally, we found Amber and Levi, who only do mobile commercial seating and upholstery. Amber and Levi came in the evening of Thursday, June 6, and

much longer than expected due to the difficulty in removing the old tacks, cleaning and prepping the surfaces, correctly shaping the foam and skillfully laying the new commercial vinyl around the curves with no seams, no wrinkles and a tight fit. By 8:30 a.m. Friday morning, June 7, all was complete and Amber and Levi left us with a beautiful and durable new bar bolster. And they were by far the most reasonable of the estimates and quotes.
