Jr. Staff Commodore Report

Hello SLYC Members. As we plan for the 2024 new membership applications, please take the time to review the following information to become familiar with the new member application process and timeline of dates.

If you have someone in mind or asked to be a sponsor for membership to the club, please note the dates and sponsor responsibilities. I have also added informational night dates this year that I will be available at the club to talk with any potential members. (Dates are provided under interested in becoming a member)

New Membership information / Timeline and Dates:

The New Member selection committee will consist of myself Jr. Staff Commodore Ken San Filippo as the Committee Chair and five flag members TBD.

Club applications will be handed out only at the in-person application meetings.

Due to a 200 Flag member cap—Openings for new members are unknown until after the club's membership dues payment for 2024 closes on 1/31/2024. Although I am projecting 4-6 openings. The board will be confirming exact membership openings at the February 8, 2024, Board meeting.

Due to club membership timeline constraints, the time frame process is tight from the application stage to the interview time to March board approval of new members. With a short timeline the following two application meeting dates are scheduled for Thursday January 18 and Tuesday, January 23 at 6:30 pm at the SLYC. Applicants only attend one of the two meetings.

Those interested in becoming a member on the following dates Jr. Staff commodore (Ken San Filippo) membership chair, will be at the club's evening social events—scheduled on the following dates October 11, Nov 17, and December 1, to provide information about the SLYC and membership application process and dates.

Reminder – the new member application process was changed in 2023:

New members to apply must have 2 sponsors, one of the

sponsors will need to have known the applicant for a minimum of 1 year. Both sponsors must be willing to help mentor the new member with the required 6 onboarding events to complete during their probationary flag membership year, not the 2 required service time commitments.

Sponsors (Honorary or Flag members) must be Members in Good Standing and one of the two sponsors must have known the applicant a minimum of one year and must be able to attest to the applicant's volunteerism, boating experience, and participation if applicable in Club activities as a guest, and a willingness to assist with the new member mentoring / and required 6 onboarding events.

Members can sponsor only one applicant.

New members are probationary Flag members their first-year contingent on completing the 6-onboarding events requirement prior to November 2024.

Two applications meetings are scheduled—applicants with sponsors attend only 1 of the 2 meeting dates.

Applications will only be distributed at the applications meetings scheduled for January 18 and 23 at the SLYC.

Perspective members, and spouse, must attend the application meeting with their sponsor (s) who signs their application.

Important Dates:

Thursday 1/18 and Tuesday 1/23, 2024, Application Meetings at 6:30 pm at the SLYC. Applicants only attend one of the two meetings.

Friday 2/9/2024 by 8 pm, completed new member application from the applicants including their sponsors forms must be received as a PDF file by Jr. Staff Commodore Ken San Filippo.

Applications are to be send as one PDF attachment via email send to (kensfloc@yahoo.com). Note - Jr Staff Commodore will reply to applicant to confirm receipt of application when received.

Sunday 2/18/2024, applicants selected for an interview will be contacted by Jr. Staff Commodore Ken San Filippo via email with an interview time slot.

Saturday 2/24/2024, Interviews scheduled at the club in person (Time to Be determined /10 am - 4 pm).

Thursday 3/7/2024, Membership chair forwards members selected to the SLYC board for approval. Note per bylaws approved in 2023, new members will be considered probational flag members their first year and must complete during their probational period 6 onboarding events (TBD with the member and Jr. Staff Commodore membership chair) this is in addition to their 2 required service time commitments.

Saturday 3/9/24, 10:30 -12:30 PM at club – A Required new member orientation meeting is scheduled for the new members selected (not sponsors). A brunch will be served / with a meet and greet social time with the flag officer team. In addition to the orientation to the club, new members onboarding activities requirement will be discussed that will need to be completed prior to Nov 2024. Members will also receive their club’s name tags, card key access and a

picture will be taken for the club directory. New members are required to pay their one-time initiation fee and SLYC annual dues at this event.

Saturday 4/13/24, Noon – projected date – 2024 club calendar not approved until Dec 2023. New members will be asked to attend – the 87th annual San Luis Yacht Club Opening Day held at the club so that they can be introduced to the membership, sponsors present would be nice but not required.

Jay Johnson

May 12, 1947 - August 6, 2023



Jay Johnson was a member of the San Luis Yacht Club since 2015 and is survived by his wife Debbie Collins. “Veteran (Purple Heart), Writer, Author, Athlete, Businessman, Family Man, and Dear Friend”. These are the words of a good friend, used to describe the life of Jay. Born Jay Clark Johnson at Mountain View Hospital in San Luis Obispo May 12, 1947. Jay attended Sinsheimer Elementary and graduated from San Luis Obispo High School class of 1966 lettering in basketball, baseball, and golf. He enlisted in the US Army and was inducted March 14, 1967. Private Johnson received a Letter of Commendation being one of only 40 out of 45,000 trainees to achieve the maximum score on the combat test. Jay was sent to the front lines of Vietnam where he was wounded in combat in October of 1968 and received a Purple Heart Medal for his service. After his return, Jay then graduated from UCLA March 22, 1974, receiving his Bachelor of Arts from The College of Letters and Science. At UCLA he found his passion for writing, books, and movies. Many residents of San

Luis Obispo may remember Jays video store located in the family building E. E. Long Appliance and Piano in downtown San Luis Obispo. Upon his retirement Jay and his wife Debbie enjoyed living in Avila Beach and traveling and exploring around the world. Jay was a member of the San Luis County Golf Club, San Luis Obispo Bike Club, and San Luis Yacht Club. Jay is survived by his wife Debbie Collins-Johnson, son William Johnson, son Cooper Johnson, stepson Travis Collins, stepdaughter Carrie Collins, grandsons Owen, Waylon, and Duke, brother Jerry Johnson many nieces, nephews and lifetime friend and golf partner Perry Peterson.
